

Christine's unique internship journey: Gaining insights into tax consulting at WTS China

The internship at WTS China is distinct from all the other internships I've completed, and I'm grateful that WTS gave me the opportunity to participate in tax consultancy work. The following aspects make this internship unique:

Research Experience

Research is fundamental to this work. I was tasked with collecting information and regulations on topics such as NRA accounts, cryptocurrency in Hong Kong, and social insurance for foreign employees in Shanghai, and trade statistics between China and the U.S. during the tariff war. The process could be time-consuming and sometimes yielded limited practical outcomes, but it was also interesting and highly beneficial. Through this work, I absorbed a great deal of information about recent developments in the business world and their impact on taxation.

Internal Training

Every Thursday, there is an hour of training covering topics such as case sharing, AI applications, and newsletter writing. I learned a lot from colleagues' sharing of regulations and valuable experiences. At the same time, I benefited from preparing a sharing session on data assets, during which I received both encouragement and practical advice.

Professional and Harmonious Atmosphere

A notable difference at WTS compared to my previous internships is that colleagues consistently explain the entire workflow to me rather than simply informing me of task requirements. This has helped me understand where my work fits into the broader process. Although much of my work involves typical intern duties such as translation, form filling, and creating PPT slides, their detailed introductions have enabled me to better understand tax consulting practices through concrete examples. The colleagues are patient, professional, and experienced.
